Extra! Extra! Read All About It!

Staff at the Horseheads Intermediate School would like to welcome you to our school. We look forward to having a great year. The staff is charged with the responsibility of ensuring the welfare and safety of your children from the time of their arrival at school in the morning, until they are placed aboard the school buses at dismissal. In order to fulfill this responsibility, we solicit your cooperation with the following requests:

- 1. If you would like your child to be excused from school early, please send a note stating the time of dismissal, the name of the person to whom the child is to be released, and the reason for the early dismissal. Children being dismissed early will wait in the school office and may be picked up at the requested time.
- 2. School begins at 8:25 AM. Homeroom period starts at 8:00 AM. Students who do not ride the bus to school should not arrive before 7:45 AM. No supervision will be provided prior to 7:45 AM. From 7:45 AM until 8:00 AM, students will be directed to the Cafeteria. Breakfast will be available from 7:45 AM 8:20 AM. To avoid any potential unsafe situations, it is requested the stipulated arrival time be followed. The drop-off site is in the back of the building by the Field House. The front of the building is designated for buses only. To keep traffic moving at the drop-off area in the morning, please pull up all the way to the designated sign and encourage your child to have his or her things ready to exit quickly.
- 3. If your child is not going to ride home on the school bus on a given day, send a note on that day to the school office outlining your pick up plans. Children should be picked up promptly between 2:20 2:30 PM in the Art Room. Adults picking up students will be asked to sign a dismissal sheet before leaving with the children. Please park in the front of the building in the upper lot, and use the side doors to the Art Rooms at dismissal. Please do not arrive before 2:20 PM. Recess is held on the blacktop of the upper parking lot until this time and classes do not end until 2:15 PM.
- 4. Students who have notes for early dismissal or for other dismissal arrangements are to take a note to their homeroom teacher in the morning. Without a note, your child will be placed on the assigned bus as regular.
- 5. On the first day of school, several papers need to be read and signed. One very <u>important notice</u> is <u>the EMERGENCY GO HOME</u> form. Please be sure that your child is aware of the emergency address. Please be sure to alert us to any changes that may occur throughout the school year in order for the changes to be made here at school.
- 6. Should any questions or concerns arise during the school year, we would ask that you contact your child's teacher first, per school district policy. Further questions can be directed to the building administrators.

- 7. Please note an important message from the Transportation Department. If you should have any questions, please feel free to call us at 739-6366.
 - "In an effort to cut costs and increase efficiency, we will be consolidating some of our bus runs. As a result, your child's bus number(s) and bus times may change, and your child may be on the bus a little longer than last year. In addition, due to limited space on the buses, we are no longer able to allow friends of students to ride their bus to and from school with them."
- 8. Important Open House Information. The Annual Open House is scheduled for **Tuesday, September 9**th, **between 6:30 PM 7:30 PM**. This is always such a great evening. The halls are crowded with students and their families. There will be displays in the Cafeteria by organizations including the scouts. PTO will begin their annual membership drive. Please join our organization as we do so much for the school. We need and appreciate your support. **The structure of this evening will be as follows: 5**th **grade Team/Classroom presentations will be from 6:30 PM 7:00 PM with visits to special area classes from 7:00-7:30 and 6**th **grade special area visits will be from 6:30 PM to 7:00 PM with Team/Classroom presentations from 7:00 PM to 7:30PM**. Please note that the structure of the evening will allow parents to briefly meet each teacher and learn valuable information about school this year. If you wish to spend more time with the teacher, please set up a conference for another time.

FAMILY VACATIONS



Absences due to vacation trips are not excused absences. Before making vacation plans, please consult the school calendar. Parents are strongly discouraged from taking their children out of school for family vacations because valuable classroom instructional time can never be replaced by make-up assignments. If parents decide to take their child out of school for vacations, please notify your child's teacher.

Because such extended absences are not excused, students are expected to request their work <u>upon return</u>. An appropriate time frame will be given to return the assignments. Students should be encouraged by parents to practice academic skills while on the trip (i.e. journaling, applying math to situations, finding science/historical connections, etc.)

Bullying

- intent to cause harm –
 bullies have thought
 about how to harm others
- imbalance of power bullies use power to control or harm their victims
- repetition bullies often target the same people over and over

- 9. Thinking about your Thinking (Metacognition)
- 10. Thinking and Communicating with Clarity and Precision

ADVANCED ART PROGRAM



Advanced Art classes will be offered to fifth and sixth grade students who are identified as both highly talented and highly interested in Art. The criteria for the program selection are:

- 1. The student consistently demonstrates excellence in art skills, technique, and creative problem solving with a variety of art forms and media.
- 2. The student consistently completes assignments on time and in a quality manner.
- 3. The student demonstrates a positive attitude in Art. The student exhibits self-motivation with a high degree of interest in pursuing Art. Initially, each student's ability level will be assessed through a Composite Drawing Test and beginning art projects. Recommendations from former Elementary Art Teachers are considered in the selection process.

The Advanced Art Program begins mid-late October. Advanced art classes are held during the school day, and are in addition to the student's regular art class. Fifth Grade AA classes meet on Day 3 at 1:30 PM - 2:15 PM. Both 6^{th} Grade AA classes meet on Day 6 at 1:30 PM - 2:15 PM. Parents of those students accepted will be notified and asked to sign a permission slip. Class attendance is mandatory for participating students. Students must remember to be on time and prepared for this class. Please understand that space is limited with only two classes of Advanced Art available for each grade level. Students who were in Advanced Art or an Art Enrichment program previously are not automatically guaranteed a spot for this school year. ALL students will be assessed on a continuous basis for potential inclusion or removal from this program.

Students are required to bring a wooden #2 pencil to each and every art class.
