

EVEN THEN, HE IS TEMPTED BY HER, BUT LETS HER GO.





## But Hyde has other plans.

NO LONGER IN CONTROL, JEKYLL TRANSFORMS...

...AND KILLS IVY.





# Events Leading To the Climax

HYDE SEEKS HELP FROM LANYON, WHO CONFRONTS HIM.

TRAPPED, HYDE SHARES HIS SECRET.

# The film is also loaded with symbolism (brought out by the director).

SPLIT SCREENS INDICATE DUALITY.

THE BOILING POT SYMBOLIZES JEKYLL'S SEXUAL FRUSTRATION.





# Irony: Jekyll dies on his lab table. The fire symbolizes his descent into Hell.



#### Direction

MAMOULIAN OFTEN USES FIRST-PERSON POV CAMERA ANGLES. THIS FORCES US TO IDENTIFY WITH JEKYLL.





# Significantly, when we first see Jekyll *and* Hyde, it's in a mirror.

# Hyde's appearance is intentionally ape-like to suggest evolution in reverse.
