

Collateral (2004): Recap

When confronted by Vincent...




...Max can no longer do things the "safe" way.

By the end, Max is a reluctant man of action.




The Climax: Is Max a match for Vincent?

Technology: Lighting


Mann gives the film a "cool" look through the lighting.

In support: Smith and Ruffalo


