
Director Focus




Directors are sort of like quarterbacks...

THEY ALSO GENERALLY ASSEMBLE THE TALENT.






Some producers are very hands-on; others just let the director work.




Sometimes, directors serve as their own producers.

Directors have to know a little bit about every aspect of film.



Alfred Hitchcock, the Master of Suspense






