### Origins: Director Alfred Hitchcock

The most famous director of his time, and probably the second-most famous director of all time, Hitchcock was known as The Master Of Suspense.



#### Early Career

Born in Figland, Hitchcock started as an art director. By the late 1920's, he was directing films.

#### Coming to America: 1939




 Hollywood studio chief David O. Selznick signed up Hitchcock amid much fanfare. The two men ended up hating each other.

#### Freed of Selznick, in the 1950's, Hitchcock went on a tear.

 In real life, Hitchcock was a bizarre man, obsessed with death and toilets. On TV, his dry gallows humor worked perfectly, making him a household name.

#### North By Northwest (1959)




 Costing 4 million dollars (29 million today), <u>North By</u> <u>Northwest</u> was a big hit...but it also made Hitchcock mad. *Movies shouldn't cost this much*... Intending to prove a point, Hitchcock wanted to shoot his next film on the cheap.

 He further insulted Hollywood by announcing that he intended to use the crew from his television show to shoot the film.

- The idea of someone having a secret appears in his work as well




