

### Robert Mattey built several hydraulic sharks.




Spielberg called the shark Bruce (and "the Great White Turd").

### The Camera is the shark.

Nothing like Bruce had ever been attempted before (the SPFX department originally wanted to do miniatures), and he often broke down.



#### So Spielberg improvised.

#### Filters and underexposures were used for a night feel.




### **Post Production**

Spielberg and editor Verna Fields "made up" the last third of the film as they went.




### The last scenes were a mix of location and studio shots.

#### John Williams did the famous score—Spielberg laughed at it (at first).




### Of course, it turned out to be very effective.
