4th Grade Band Information:

Each fourth grade band student receives a lesson once every six days. Lessons are typically from 8:00am - 8:30am in the music room. Students should come to lessons on time with their instrument, required books, and yellow card. The yellow card tells students which exercises they should be practicing for each lesson.

Parents and students should set up a time and place to practice each day to establish a successful practice routine. Having a parent sit in on beginner practice not only helps to encourage students to practice, it also helps to have a reminding force of beginning basics. Each fourth grade band student will have a packet of beginner information and basics in his or her band folder. Please make sure your student has their instrument, all their materials, and is prepared for each lesson.
