TRYING TO CHANGE THE UMPIRING



During the early years of FDR's presidency, many opponents of the New Deal argued that his new programs violated the US Constitution (meaning the government was grabbing too much power). The Supreme Court declared two important programs to be unconstitutional meaning they violate the constitution and are illegal:

- AAA program that paid farmers not to grow crops
- NRA program that set prices and wages for businesses

FDR feared that the Supreme Court might continue to strike down his New Deal programs, so in 1937 he proposed adding 6 more judges to the Supreme Court – going from 9 to 15. As president, he would have the power to appoint the new judges – allowing him to pick judges that supported his policies.
