Jacob August Riis (May 3, 1849 – May 26, 1914) was a muckraking journalist known for using his photographic and journalistic talents to help the poor living in in New York City. Riis, who came from a poor family and was even homeless for a time, used his job as a newspaper reporter to gather photos of the filthy, crowded immigrant slums. He attempted to improve the bad living conditions of poor people by exposing their living conditions to the middle and upper classes.
