 - Oregon Trail
 - Santa Fe Trail

- Topography
- Weather
- Disease
- Native Americans

- The demand for beef turned cattle ranching into big business
- Wild Cattle = Longhorns
- "The Cattle Kingdom"
 - Southwest to the Grassy Great Planes

- A method of Identification
- Each had significance

- Ranchers would drive their cattle in groups
- Chisholm Trail
- Dangers

 - From Man

Farming in the West: Farming in the West

I. Homestead Act of 1862

Congress passed a law that would give land to people in the west.

- Positives
 - People received Free LAND to Farm
- Problems
 - People didn't have enough Money
 - Large companies illegally took the money

II. Oklahoma Land Rush

- 100,000 people lined up to take free farm land
- Boomers: Those who charged in
- Sooners: Those who sneaked in early

III. Sodbusters

- The land in the Great Plains was great for farming
 - Thick layer of Sod
- Sodbusters cut through the sod to the fertile land

IV. Populist Party

- Farmers and Labor Unions came together in 1892 to form a political party
- They demanded:
 - Income Taxes
 - Increase in farm prices
 - Free silver to farmers
