







These posters show just some of the many sacrifices the government was asking Americans on the home front to make during the war.

America had been preparing for war even before Pearl Harbor. Factories producing war materials expanded and we held the first peacetime draft in our history. Very quickly after the Japanese attack on December 7<sup>th</sup> of 1941, volunteers flooded to recruiting stations and the government began to ask Americans to make huge sacrifices for the war effort.
